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## Scope of Practice

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Cardiovascular disease remains a leading cause of death and morbidity in the United States, despite substantial gains in diagnostics, prevention and treatment. The 16th Annual Oregon Cardiovascular Symposium will provide a thorough review of the literature and update participants on current evidence-based practice for heart failure and arrhythmias as well as how certain comorbidities affect the patients. It will provide balanced expert opinion and recommendations of key advances and state of the art cardiovascular care that clinicians and patients expect. There is a persistent gap between the practice of cardiology and guideline-recommended evaluation and therapy. In a time of continually changing information based on new research findings, it is difficult for providers to maintain an up-to-date knowledge base and, therefore, competency in these areas. As a result, the performance of the physician and other members of the cardiac care team frequently lags behind state-of-the-art practices. The 16th Annual Oregon Cardiovascular Symposium addresses this gap by providing an extensive expert review of clinical cardiology through didactic lectures, panel discussions, and case presentations which will emphasize newer concepts of diagnosis, decision making, community support, pharmacology and interventional therapy in areas of ischemic and valvular heart disease, cardiac arrhythmias, heart failure and other clinically pertinent topics.

## Learning Objectives

1. Recognize appropriate imaging modalities to assess cardiac toxicity.
2. Evaluate guidelines from Cardiac and Oncology Societies, and identify how to incorporate into clinical practice.

5. Review potential strategies to identify patients at risk for peri-procedural right heart failure.
6. Discuss mechanical support strategies in definitive management of right heart failure.
7. Define optimal care transition interventions.
8. Review the scientific merits of the Cabana trial.
9. List two tactics to reduce administrative and professional burdens.
10. Know how MRI contributes to the management of coronary artery disease.
11. Identify gaps in care in your current institution which can be addressed through the creation of women's heart services
12. Discuss the controversy 'Is too much exercise bad for your heart?'
